Year: 9

What topics are covered during the year?

In year 9 the themes that are covered are: Algebra Links - E.g. Solving equations, substitution, sequences, straight line/quadratic graphs. Space and Travel - E.g. Speed distance time calculations, area and volume, standard form. Secret Service - E.g. Currency, time and time zones, scale, bearings. Garden Design - E.g. Perimeter, area, volume, angles, 3D shapes, Pythagoras' theorem. That's Life! - E.g. Economic maths, number skills, percentage, income tax, interest rates. Olympics/Sports Day - E.g. Rounding, fractions, decimals, percentages, averages. Each theme covers topics from each attainment target: Number, Algebra, Shape and Space and Data Handling.

What key assessments will take place?

Year 9 have a Winter and Summer examination that consist of a non calculator paper, a calculator paper and a mental test. The Winter examination takes place after Christmas and the Summer examination takes place in the Summer term.

How can parents help their child's learning?

Parents can help pupils with homework, and take an interest in www.Mymaths.co.uk. This is an excellent resource that gives pupils access to all topics that are tested. The work is broken down by level so pupils can easily identify the work that is relevant to them.

Are there any trips, visits or special equipment needed?

Pupils need to come fully equipped to lessons with a pen, pencil, ruler, rubber, protractor, pair of compasses and a calculator (preferably a scientific one to last through the whole of school).
