To allow your child to make the most of their exam preparation time with us they will leave school to commence their study leave on <u>Friday 5 June 2015</u>. Prior to this they will have some bespoke revision lessons in departments on those days when an examination is taking place. If your child is currently underachieving in English or Mathematics you will be invited to attend a meeting with one member of the Senior Leadership Team to discuss their progress, effort and preparation for these crucial GCSE's.

We look forward to seeing you at our Year 11 Parents' Evening on Tuesday 24 February 2015 to allow you to discuss your child's progress with their subject teachers. On <u>Tuesday 3 March 2015</u> all of Year 11 will attend a 'how to revise' revision skills roadshow in the theatre from 12.00pm - 1.00pm, this will help to give them revision strategies and memory techniques to support effective personal study.

Attendance at Revision Classes once Study Leave Starts

Once the study leave begins (and in the week prior to this) we will be putting together a bespoke range of revision sessions, some of which will be led by teachers in the lessons when they would have had Year 11 anyway. Others will be targeted sessions prior to exams, e.g. if they have Science on a Tuesday morning we will be putting in place Monday PM revision.

Year 11 Prom Update

As you may know, our Year 11 Prom will be taking place on Friday 8 May 2015. Letters went out to pupils approximately 2 weeks ago and payments have already started coming in. If pupils need activation codes for ParentPay or barcoded letters please ask them to see Miss Jones.

Year 11 ICT Coursework Deadline

The deadline for all Year 11 ICT GCSE coursework is the 12 February 2015. The ICT Coursework is worth 60% towards the final grade, therefore it is important this work is completed to the highest standard possible and that the deadline is met. If pupils need to catch-up and/or improve their coursework they must attend lunch time or after school classes.

On Monday 9 February 2015 there is a planned coursework catch-up session after school from 3.00pm to 6.00pm, allowing pupils every opportunity to produce their ICT coursework. We hope that you will encourage your child to produce their ICT coursework to the best of their ability and if necessary to attend catch-up sessions.

Year 11 Post 16 Applications

If your child is in Year 11 and hasn't currently made an application for post 16 provision can you ask them to come to the Careers Office for help and support either first thing in the morning, break time, lunchtime or after school.
